Written Assignment

Write a letter to the local newpaper in which you, using what you've learned as evidence, respond to one of the following questions.

- 1. What is a low-energy lifestyle? Look for evidence of low-energy lifestyles: individual case studies, such as Amory Lovins, or national case studies such as Sweden.
- 2. Is recycling effective? Look for evidence of recycling in Canada, bottlenecks that inhibit recycling, strategies that successfully enhance recycling efforts.
- 3. How much are you willing to pay in the short run to receive economic and environmental benefits in the long run? Explore costs and payback times of energy-efficient appliances, energy-saving light bulbs, and weather stripping.
- 4. Should we eat lower on the food chain? Look for evidence in a vegetarian diet, or a diet including insects, in which it could save land.
- 5. How can humans work with ecosystems? Look for evidence in composting, organic gardening, land reclamation, rebuilding degraded lands, tree-planting.
- 6. Another question which may have occurred to you so far in the course. Run it by me before you begin.

Your strategy:

- 1. Make sure you can define the terminology in your question.
- 2. Begin by doing some reading in the text, and on line sources. Make some notes about the topic and keep track of the web sites.
- 3. Find at least one peer-reviewed article on the topic (I will show you in class how to find them on the library site).
- 4. Since it is a letter, your writing will be informal. However, keep it succinct and on topic, and cite your sources. Include a title and your name at the top.
- 5. Look at the notes you have written and organize them into an appropriate sequence.
- 6. The paper should have an introductory paragraph, including the question, and a conclusion.
- 7. Remember as you're writing that we are looking for solutions to environmental issues.
- 8. The paper should be about 2 ½ pages double-spaced (no more than 3 pages max).
- 9. Include a reference section at the end.
